- 1. ALL FEES TO BE PAID AT THE TIME OF ENTRY.
- 2. All entries must be made in the name of the bona-fide owner of the exhibits, hereinafter in the conditions and regulations called the 'Exhibitor', and that word shall include any Firm or Corporation.
 - All entries MUST be made on the official form, enclosed in this schedule, obtained from the Secretary, downloaded from our website or from Showdayonline.
 - These forms are to be completed by and signed by the Exhibitor, or some person authorised by them, and must be handed to, or posted to the Secretary, together with the entry fees.
 - No entry will be valid unless these conditions are complied with
- All exhibits must be in their allotted places on the ground and ready for judging by 8.30am (unless specified) on the day of the Show.
- 4. Exhibitors will be requested to state as accurately as possible at the time of entry. THE DATE OF BIRTH OF ALL STOCK IN CLASSES WHERE THE AGE IS SPECIFIED; AND, IN ALL CLASSES OF SHEEP, EXCEPT CORRIEDALE, THE DATE OF LAST SHEARING.
- 5. Exhibitors most provide sufficient attendants to take charge of each entry of Cattle and Horses and lead them into the Show Ring when required. Exhibitors failing to comply with this regulation will be liable to forfeit their prizes at the discretion of the Committee.

Horses

- 1. The committee reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient numbers
- 2. All horses must be haltered and must at all times have at least one person in attendance
- 3. If any entry in the Horse and Pony Sections is scratched, on Medical or Veterinarian advice a refund of eighty percent of the entry fee will be made provided advice of the scratching is given prior to the judging of the class for which the scratching is made, and the Medical or Veterinary Certificate is produced to the Secretary of the Association.
- No substitute for original entries will be allowed in any of the Horse or Pony Classes without a Veterinary Certificate.
- 5. All horses and ponies entered in a class where the height is stipulated must carry a current height certificate, which must be produced before the prizes are awarded.
- 6. No horse will be judged unless the rider or the horse is carrying the correct number.
- 7. Drug testing for forbidden substances may take place.

RAS Yellow/Red Card System

This show supports the RAS "In-Line Resolution Process" system using Yellow and Red cards (as per resolution at 2023 Annual Conference). A yellow warning card and/or a red penalty/expulsion card may be issued for any abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, judges, **fellow** competitors, or any other third party **connected** with the show, that could bring **the equestrian** discipline into disrepute.

Public and competitors enter the show grounds at their own risk. Whilst every precaution has been taken to avoid harm to visitors, exhibitors and all others using the grounds, the Hawarden A & P Association will not be responsible for any injury, maiming or accident suffered by any person entering the premises irrespective of whether such injury maiming or accident is occasioned by any act or omission of the Hawarden A & P Association.

Judges

- 1. In all classes where three prizes have been awarded, THE JUDGES are directed to "commend" or "highly commend" the other exhibits worthy of that distinction.
- 2. Judges of stock, in arriving at their decisions, are directed not to give undue weight to high condition (except in the classes for prime stock), but to award the prizes to the animals in each class which they consider best represent the particular breed or description entitled to be encouraged. The judges are requested to pass over all whose want of condition betokens weakness of constitution, however great their merits may be in other respects Where there are, in any class, animals of different ages, the judges are required to take such difference into consideration in awarding the prize; and, also in the case of females, as to whether in young or in milk, so that want of condition from either of these causes may not militate against the animal possessing the greatest merit; but any animal which, in the opinion of the judges, is barren if not proved contrary) shall not be eligible to take a prize, except in prime stock classes.
- The public must keep away from the judges while they are judging.
- 4. In the event of there being no competition in any class, no prizes will be given unless the judges certify to particular merit. Power is also reserved to withhold a prize where the judge or judges consider it ought not to be awarded, for want of sufficient merit, even where there is competition.
- 5. Competition means, two or more exhibitors, whose exhibits are judged, competing for the prize or prizes in the particular class for which prizes are awarded. Ties to count one win each.

GENERAL

- All protests (complaints) must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary either before or after the judges have proceeded to their duties. Any exhibitor entering a protest must deposit \$10.00 which may be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. If the protest be lodged before the judges proceed to their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the exhibitor, If after that, the onus of proof will be on the party protesting. No protest will be received later than two hours after the prize tickets are affixed.
 - The Executive Committee will decide all protests (complaints), as soon as practicable, and there shall be no appeal of their decision.
- Rule 30 of Equestrian Competitions & Judges Rule Book: "No competitor or exhibitor or members of their family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless they first obtain the permission of the Show Convenor/Manager/Ring Master or Ring Steward the most senior of whom shall carry the decision on the day".
- 3. Sheep Championships can be won by single entry or pen of two or three. All Sheep entered in the Breed Classes must be entered in the recognised Stud Books.
- The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage, or misdelivery of stock or implements exhibited at the Show.
- 5. No animal or goods of any description, excepting those entered in the Catalogue, will be allowed on the grounds unless special permission has been granted by the Committee.
- 6. Attendants in charge of stock are admitted free, on production of pass, and are subject to the order of the Stewards.
- Extra stock, etc. not admissible under any of the enumerated classes in any form, may be exhibited by paying the same entrance fee as in the class to which they are most closely allied. Honorary Certificates may be awarded.
- 8. Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by a kindred Association registered under 'The Agricultural and Pastoral Societies Act, 1908', the Committee of the Association shall have the power to endorse such disqualification or suspension and disqualify and suspend such person or firm accordingly.
- 9. No stock or implements exhibited can be removed from the yard until after 4pm on the day of the Show, without special order from the President or Vice-Presidents.
- 10. All persons admitted into the Show Grounds shall be subject to the Rules and order of the Committee and admittance may be refused to any person who has not paid the entrance fee or who does not hold a pass admitting them.
- 11. Should any exhibitor, in the opinion of the Committee, infringe any of these conditions and regulations, or refuse to comply with the directions of the Committee, or be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice, or any deceit or concealment either in entering or exhibiting stock, all exhibits of such exhibitor shall be disqualified, and their name shall not appear in the Official Prize List, The Committee shall have power to suspend such exhibitor from exhibiting at any Exhibition for such period as they may think fit.
- 12. Any exhibitor infringing any of the above Regulations shall be subject to be dealt with as may be decided upon by the Section Marshal and Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 13. Winners of Challenge Cups or Trophies shall hold them for one year and are to have their names inscribed thereon. CUPS AND TROPHIES MUST BE CLEANED AND RETURNED TO THE SECRETARY BY SHOW DAY.


Supreme Exhibitor Sash

This ribbon is awarded to an exhibitor who has shown a sense of fair play, courtesy, punctuality and is a keen supporter of their chosen section.

This person does not have to have won any major prizes or placing, however, they have shown enthusiasm and a positive attitude throughout the competition.

The recipient of this award is to be judged by the section marshals and the stewards.

The supreme exhibitor award is to be awarded to ONE person per section.

OVERNIGHT STAY: Anyone wishing to use our sale-yards the night before the Show, can do so by phoning Pip Hunter-Weston 027 2452731, at a cost of \$5 per night. (Any damage will be charged to the owner, and you enter at your own risk).

No overnight camping of horses on Show grounds allowed.

All horse droppings/ hay /manure to be removed by owner on show day.

RULE BOOKS: For anyone wishing to purchase an RAS Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book they are available from RAS Head Office. The order form is on the RAS website – ras.org.nz/equestrian section/Form page Product Order form.

GRAND PARADE: Prize winners are required to, and all other horses are welcome to parade.

CLEAN SPORT: The use of tranquilisers, stimulants, or any drug capable of affecting the performance of horses or ponies is forbidden.

Tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing is under the RAS Clean Sport Judiciary Committee procedures and rules.

HEIGHT RESTRICTIONS & RULES: The rider of any Horse or Pony shall not be changed for the duration of the section being judged. In all height classes, Horses may be entered in only one section.

All Horses must carry a current R.A.S. Height Certificate. (Refer Rule CDA 1a, RAS Rule Book). ONLY DISTRICT COMPETITORS MAY BE MEASURED ON SHOW DAY - **no exceptions**. District Classes are restricted to Horses owned and ridden by persons residing between the Hurunui and Waipara Rivers.

No horse under 3 years of age is permitted to be shown under saddle at this Show.

NOVICE CLASSES: A Novice is a horse or pony that has not won six firsts in any saddle conformation classes at day of show. Competitors achieving six firsts at show day may transfer to open classes within entered section.

Novices to be shown in SNAFFLE BITS in Novice Classes.



Novices may enter the appropriate Novice classes for their wins, and any open classes.

NOVICE CHAMPION AND RESERVE to be judged from Hacks, Park Hacks, Saddle Hunters and

Whips exceeding 72cm are not permitted in Show Classes.



Horses may be entered in one showing section only i.e. Park Hacks, Hacks, Standardbred and Saddle Hunters, but all may enter the working and walking saddle horse classes. No class will be held up for horses in another ring.

Horses must be named in each class entered.

RAS YELLOW/ RED CARD SYSTEM: This show supports the RAS "In-Line Resolution Process" system. The President of the Show/Show Official/Committee Member and/or the Chief Steward of the Section/Stand may issue a yellow warning card and/or a red penalty/expulsion card, applicable as indicated in the RAS affiliated Show or Event own Rules and Regulations, to the Person Responsible (PR), in regards to (i) Abuse of animals, (ii) Inappropriate behaviour. Refer to https://www.ras.org.nz/wp-content/uploads/2023/08/In-Line-Resolution-Process-Policy-2023.pdf for full rules and implementation.

BACK NUMBERS: Breast plate number holders are encouraged. A number is required for each animal-rider-exhibitor combination in all classes (including led classes).

Hawarden A & P Association numbers at a cost of \$4 per entry are available to competitors. This will be refunded, if returned by 5pm on Show day.

HELMET STANDARD HATS and SAFETY HELMETS:

a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.

b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.

c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at http://www.ras.org.nz – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS.



SHEEP

This year the Hawarden A & P Show are proud to be hosting a Royal Event in the Sheep and Wool Section. The Royal Event / Section is run under the by-laws and regulations of the RAS and of the Hawarden A&P show Association.

The following protocols apply;

After close off of entries, if there are less than five (5) animals and/or three (3) exhibitors entered in the Royal Event / Section classes specified, the Hawarden Show may amalgamate classes / sections as necessary.

The classes eligible for the Royal medals are stated as a Royal Event / Section.

Supervisor: Andy Sidey 027-262-4399, Stu Jensen 03-314-4581, Kate Boyd.

Morning tea will be provided and thanks to PGG Wrightsons for providing a BBQ after judging. SHEEP TO BE PENNED NO LATER THAN 8.30am. JUDGING COMMENCES 9.00am.

All sheep must be entered in the name of bona fide owner or owners and must be from a Registered Flock.

The original breeders name must be stated where there has been a change of ownership of a registered flock of the same breed as the sheep being entered.

All sheep entered in the Breed Classes must be entered in the recognised Flock Book or the Dam and Sire must be eligible for the Flock Book.

All sheep must be Brucellosis accredited. Brucellosis certificates to be produced on request. No stud breeders selling Rams on a commercial basis can enter in the Flock section.

Lamb Classes - No Lamb to be born before 1st July in the year prior to the show.

All entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. This rule will be strictly enforced.

All sheep to be shown in Natural Condition where stated.

Natural Condition to mean:

- 1. That the wool has not been trimmed in any way except crutching or dagging.
- 2. That there has not been any colouring, oiling or locking other than dipping.
- 3. That the Sheep have not been housed, rugged or covered in any way since last shearing and must be fairly shorn.

Judges will be instructed to disqualify all sheep which they consider unfairly shorn or excessively trimmed or excessively coloured, also sheep on which any adhesive substance, string or other

material has been used for the purpose of concealing or altering any defect in the fleece or form of the sheep.

Exhibitors are reminded that the use of Bloom Dip or any artificial colouring is now covered by Government Regulation.

NAIT REQUIREMENTS:

A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.

All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hook carcass competition come under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag. It is the livestock exhibitors responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT within 48 hours prior to leaving the farm / property for the show and then within 48 hours of returning from the Show.

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

All animals entered for showing or exhibiting must be from a current TB Clear Status Herd. A copy of the current TB test certificate must be attached to entry forms. The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.

There are two documents required:

First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area – all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with it's current routine TB testing requirements.

Second document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.

The owner of a dam of an animal at the date of mating shall be considered the breeder. Name of breeder to be stated.
